

Post Is Named After Veterans

Newly-Formed Unit At Houston Pays Honor To Pair Who Gave Lives

HOUSTON, Del., March 15—(Special).—The Houston Post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars was organized Wednesday evening at a meeting in the Houston Fire Hall, when 33 members present chose for the name of their post "The Marvel-Taylor Post of Houston," in honor of William H. Marvel, son of Mrs. Lyda Marvel of Houston, and William Taylor, of Williamsville, both of whom lost their lives while serving their country in World War II.

Mr. Marvell is survived by a wife, Mrs. Margaret Marvel, of Houston, and two children. Mr. Taylor is survived by a wife, Mrs. Fustinia Taylor.
