

Armistice Day Rites Planned

Speer Post to Hold Service; New Negro V. F. W. Unit Is Organized at Dover

An all-day Armistice Day program was arranged last night by J. Ferdinand Speer Post, Veteran of Foreign Wars, at a meeting in post headquarters, 3208 Market Street.
