

## NEW POST OF V.F.W. PLANNED AT CAMDEN

The creation of a new post for the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Delaware was announced at the official visit of Elmer L. Gray, commander of the State Department of the V. F. W., to Clarence Vinson Post at Camden, last night. The new unit for Negro veterans will be known as the Adkins-Cabbage Post of Dover. The announcement was made by John E. Naylor, aide-de-camp. The formation of the post has received the endorsement of the Council of Administration of the V. F. W.

The new organization is one of three proposed posts, which quota has been set by the national headquarters this year for this state.

Those who have applied for membership are Jabe White, James Miles, Harry Rias, Samuel Granger, Roland Fountain, N. Black, C. Gibbs, Wilbert Fisher, Fletcher Benson, Asbury, Brewington, Charles Elliot, Walter Pitts, Clarence Shockley, Joshua Griffen, and Earl Murray.

The post will be the second Negro V. F. W. post in Delaware. The Norman D. Scott, No. 2765, being the first.
