

New Polish V.F.W. Post Officers to Be Installed

Walter J. Przywara of 928 Pine Street will be installed as commander of the newly organized White Eagle Post No. 7006, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Monday evening in the auditorium of the William P. Bancroft School.

The post will hold regular meetings on Wednesdays at the Polish-American Citizens' Club at Eighth and Kirkwood Streets.

Mr. Przywara, a former technical sergeant in the Army Ordnance Section, was discharged Oct. 27, 1945. Prior to his discharge he served with Headquarters 87th Ordnance Battalion two years in the African and Italian campaigns earning four battle stars.

After graduating from Wilmington High School, Mr. Przywara enrolled in the electrical engineering course at the University of Delaware, completing it in 1935. He also attended the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. He is now back at work for the Eastern Malleable Iron Co., where he worked for five years prior to his induction.
